



## ***Gym Sask TG Virtual Competition Information***

*This is a living document and will be updated as needed.*

### **Registration:**

Registrations will be submitted to the host club in one document and with one payment for each virtual event.

### **Recording Requirements:**

#### **Trampoline**

- Videos uploaded for entry may not exceed 1:20 in duration
- HD will be judged by a judge on-site.
- TOF machine will be used.
- Routines must be filmed from the side of the trampoline, centrally positioned
- The camera must capture the routine in its entirety without being moved up and down. The head at the top of each element and feet at the bottom of the trampoline bed must always be visible within the frame.
- Videos are to be done in horizontal orientation
- Filming is to commence with the gymnast presenting to the videographer and must continue until the routine has concluded, the gymnast has re-presented to the videographer and is ready to leave the trampoline in a controlled manner.

#### **Double-Mini Trampoline**

- Filming is to commence and conclude with gymnast presenting to videographer.
- The camera must be placed parallel to the runway and must follow the athlete from at least mid-run, hurdle through to the landing. The camera should be placed across from the middle of the spotter zone.
- The head at the top of each frame and feet at the bottom must always be visible within the frame without movement of the camera up and down.
- Videos are to be done in horizontal orientation.
- Landings must be controlled with filming continuing until the gymnast re-presents to the judges and leaves the landing area.
- Passes must be filmed using a current competition landing mat with landing zones clearly visible.

## Tumbling

- The camera should be placed between two thirds and three quarters of the way down the tumbling track, where the tumbling judges would normally sit.
- Passes will be filmed to reflect what a judge would see from start to finish of the run including the landing.
- Filming must commence with a gymnast presenting to the videographer.
- The head at the top of each frame and feet at the bottom must be visible at all times within the frame without movement of the camera up and down.
- Videos are to be done in horizontal orientation.
- Landings must be controlled with filming continuous until the gymnast re-presents to the judges and leaves the landing zone. The landing zone must be clearly marked.

## Competition Simulation:

**Step 1:** Competition will run Saturday to Friday (7days). With the exception of trampoline, clubs have the flexibility to record routines any time during these days. All gymnasts of the same level and club must be on the same day and session. Extenuating circumstances for medical reasons will be considered as long as the gymnast's routines are in the 7 day window. These requests must be sent to the host club.

For trampoline, in order to make use of the TOF machine, the participating clubs will need to coordinate the filming of tramp so that the machine may be sent to the other club. For example, GA films tramp Saturday to Monday and CA films Tuesday to Friday. Gym Sask will be responsible for shipping/transporting the TOF machine between clubs.

- Judging will occur Saturday to Monday

**Step 2:** • Coaches will hold up a whiteboard/paper with athlete's name and level into the recording device before the athlete competes routine.

**Step 3:** Videos must be submitted by 11:59 pm on the Friday using the link or email address provided by the host club.

## Judging:

- Judges will be assigned by the Saskatchewan judging chair. Routines will be judged by the judges on their own time Saturday and Sunday.
- Each judge will have their own spreadsheet to input their scores.
- Judging must be completed and scores submitted to the host club by 11:59 on Sunday.
- Judges must abide by the following:
  - Judge routine only once, continuously in real time
  - No consultation with another judge
  - Judge each level for each event on the same day and time
- Preliminary results will be sent out by the host club to the participating clubs by Tuesday at 11:00 am. Clubs will have until Tuesday at 4:00 pm to inquire about scores to the

chief judge and cc the host club. Final results will be sent out by the host club by Wednesday at 12:00 pm to participating clubs and Gym Sask. The results will be posted on the new Gym Sask results page.

- The host club will mail out awards to each participating club.

#### **Judge Payment**

- Judges will be paid per routine not hourly for virtual events
- Judges are to be paid by the host club

#### **Equipment Required by Clubs:**

- iPads/tablets for recording with the ability to upload videos to Vimeo.
- Tripod for iPad/Tablet is **strongly** recommended.
- Whiteboard/Paper to write athletes name & level on to show to camera for judges.
